SSEES/UCL KAZAN' COURSE SUMMER 2017

APPLICATION FORM NOTES

INTRODUCTION

The Kazan' summer course for students of SSEES, UCL is co-organised by SSEES and Dr Roy Bivon of *Study in Russia*. Dr Bivon organises summer courses for students at a number of British universities, as well as courses for students on their year abroad for RLUS Ltd.

Study in Russia will arrange a complete package consisting of your course and accommodation in homestay accommodation with breakfast. You will be responsible for booking and paying for your own air tickets.

Please see the preliminary information document given to you by SSEES for information on other important matters related to the Kazan' programme.

DATES OF COURSE

This year's course will run from **17th June to 15th July 2017**. You will receive a visa invitation for these exact dates and you are not allowed to enter Russia or leave Russia earlier or later than these dates.

APPLICATION FORM

Please fill in the enclosed application form and email it to courses@studyinrussia.co.uk by **3rd February 2017** at the latest, with a deposit payment of £50. The form is also available on the website www.studyinrussia.co.uk/appformkazan.doc. Handwritten forms will not be accepted. The address that you put on the form may be used to send you your visa invitation. Much of the correspondence will be by e-mail. Please make sure that you write your e-mail address very clearly on the application form and read your e-mail on a regular basis. Please also send a scan of your passport and a deposit at the same time as your form (see below).

PASSPORT SCAN

IMPORTANT If you do not have a passport, it expires less than 21 months after the end of the course, or there aren't two blank pages in your passport, please apply NOW for a new one. *Study in Russia* cannot apply to Kazan' for your visa invitation, until we have a clear scan of the valid passport that you will use to travel to Russia. As visa invitations can take up to two months to arrive, if you delay sending us valid passport details, you may find yourself incurring considerable extra expense or, at worst, not able to attend the course.

When you email your application form please also attach a clear scan of the information pages of your passport in jpeg, Word or pdf format as an e-mail attachment. This means both the page with your photo and details, and the opposite page above or below it.

- 1) Scans should be done in high resolution and all the print should be clear when printed on A4 paper. Scans from a tablet or a mobile phone are not normally accepted. If you have problems, UCL will help to provide you with a suitable scan.
- 2) Please make sure that you do not cut off the numbers and letters on the bottom line of your passport.
- 3) Please include the complete page opposite the information page (photo and details) in the scan.

If your scan is rejected by Kazan, this may delay your visa invitation, which you will need to obtain a visa. This could either mean that you will not be able to get a visa in time to arrive at the start of the course. It may involve you in extra costs, if your visa invitation has to be sent separately from the group.

DEPOSIT

Please send your deposit to *Study in Russia* by internet banking or by cheque.

SCHEDULE OF PAYMENTS

Study in Russia will in due course send you an invoice by e-mail. The balance (total minus deposit and the contribution from UCL) is payable **by 24th March 2017** at the latest. If payment has not been received by that date, there is no guarantee that you will be able to attend the course. If you think you will have problems paying the balance by the due date, please talk to Ben Chatterley.

COSTS

SSEES will provide a travel grant of £400 towards the costs for SSEES-registered students. This will be paid directly to *Study in Russia* and deducted from your invoice.

The costs of the course are:

a) Payable to Study in Russia in advance

Course fee	£390
Homestay accommodation with breakfast	£283
Visa invitation and registration	£62
Meeting and train travel	£90
Administration charge	£45

TOTAL £870 (from which the UCL grant of £400 will be deducted).

b) Other costs

Other costs which you will pay include:

- i) the return airfare London-Moscow, which you will book directly with the relevant airline
- ii) visa application (around £90 for UK passports, different fees apply for other passports)
- iii) daily living costs in Kazan' (including lunch and supper) and travel from Kazan' to Moscow at the end of the course. Previous students have advised that £500-600 is adequate for the 4 weeks.

TRAVEL DETAILS TO KAZAN

You will book a flight to Moscow Domodedovo airport and be met by representatives of the Kazan Institute of Social Sciences. All students will then take a transfer coach to 'Kazanskii vokzal', the main train station for points east and south-east of Moscow and you will travel overnight to Kazan on the pre-booked sleeper service. You will be met in Kazan and transferred to your homestay accommodation.

FLIGHTS

You are responsible for booking your own air tickets to Moscow and back. You should book your flight directly with the airline for the exact start and end dates of the course. Russian visa regulations do not allow you to enter the country even one day before your visa starts or leave one day later than the visa ends.

All students based in the UK in June should book on the following flight:
BA233 leaving at 08.45 from Heathrow.

If you will not be living in UK in June then please book the appropriate flights from your home country, but making sure that the inward flight arrives in Moscow Domodedovo no later than 15.30. This is very important because all students will be met at Domodedovo and transferred to the railway station by coach.

TRAVELLING BACK TO MOSCOW AT THE END OF THE COURSE

You can return to Moscow either by train (Friday night, arriving Saturday morning) or by air (at the time of writing there is a 10.25 flight from Kazan on S7 airlines). There are more details on the S7 website: www.s7.ru. Click on EN for the website in English. You will usually need to buy this ticket directly from the provider although the Institute can help you if you get stuck.

INVITATION AND VISA

There are three main processes, visa invitation, visa application, and visa registration in Kazan´:

i) Visa Invitation

You will need an official visa invitation before you can apply for the visa. *Study in Russia* will obtain the invitation from Kazan´ based on the passport scan that you send with your application. We will send it to SSEES about one month before the start of the course. Please note that *Study in Russia* cannot be precise about when it will receive this document due to the complexities of Russian bureaucracy. Should there be any delay, you will be informed by e-mail.

The visa invitation will only allow you to apply for a Student Visa. Any other visa, including the Tourist Visa, is not valid for the Kazan study course.

ii) Visa application

You must make your visa application in person at one of the VSF Global offices (London or Edinburgh) once you receive your visa invitation. At time of writing there is a 5-working day service and a next day service. If you cannot return in person to collect your visa you can pay extra to have it sent to you by special delivery. Your passport will be with VSF Global throughout the visa application process so therefore please do not plan any travel for which you need your passport after the middle of May. Please note that if you are not a UK citizen, the documents the you may have to submit to obtain a visa may be different from those listed at the end of this document.

iii) Visa Registration

All visas must be registered once you arrive. This will be done by the Institute. The only visa that is permitted to be registered is the official visa from the Kazan´ Institute. So you cannot use any other visa for this purpose.

There are full details on how to obtain a visa at the end of this document.

MONEY

The easiest way of obtaining money in Russia is with your cash card. Debit cards are usually cheaper to use and any that have the Visa or MasterCard symbols should work. Please check with your bank for charges. You are advised to inform your bank that you will be using your card in Russia. Otherwise some banks may block the card. It would also be useful to set up internet banking. You can then check your bank account from an internet café and transfer funds.

You can buy roubles in the UK. Check with your local bank, travel agent or the post office. Roubles are also available at Heathrow. You are advised to obtain some before departure, as you will need them for the overnight train journey. You should also take some cash. US dollars and Euros can be changed easily, but **make sure that the notes are not torn and in pristine condition** or you may find them difficult to change. Pounds can also be changed, but there can sometimes be problems and the exchange rate is often not very good. Travellers' cheques are not recommended as they can be difficult to cash and very expensive, as you will be charged a high commission to change them and may also have to pay in UK.

AND FINALLY...

UCL will provide you with detailed information about the course and about Kazan'. You should talk to your tutor if you have any questions about them.

APPLYING FOR A VISA

Please note that the procedure can change without warning. If any of the information below is no longer accurate, please let Dr. Bivon know immediately.

Go to the VFS website <http://ru.vfsglobal.co.uk>. Select *Know your visa type* and from the next menu *Student visa*. From this menu you can get information about the visa fees, the documents required, processing time, and photo specifications. Then select *Online Application Form*. Select *Click Here* at the bottom of the page. Select *Registration* at the bottom of the page and sign up for a new account. Please keep a record of your ID number and password. Click on *Complete new application form* at the bottom of the next screen

You have to provide fingerprints to get a Russian visa. This means that you will have to go in person one of the visa agencies:

There now follows a large number of pages to fill in. You can save the application at any time and go back to them if you can remember your ID and password! Most questions are straightforward. Below you will find help with less obvious questions. If your answer is rejected, please make sure that you do not include spaces or punctuation marks in telephone numbers, etc.

APPLICATION SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED

You must have Adobe Acrobat on your computer. Select A4 (bottom left) and print the form.

Don’t forget to sign and date the form. Make sure that your signature is the same as in your passport. Stick a passport sized photograph in the box.

DOCUMENTS TO SEND WITH YOUR APPLICATION

As a student, you are not unemployed and do not need to send the documents listed on the VFS Global website for unemployed persons.

If you do not hold a UK passport, please check the VFS Global website to find out the documents that you have to send. If you hold a UK passport, these, according to the website, are the documents that you should send:

This is what the website currently states:

1. Current passport which should be valid for a minimum of six months after visa's expiration date and has at least 2 blank pages which do not need to be consecutive.
2. Visa application form filled in and printed out from this website only. Kindly ensure that the dates of your entry and exit, as entered in the application form, match with or fall within the period specified in the supporting documents.
3. One recent passport size photo glued to the indicated space on the application form.
4. A letter of invitation issued by a Russian Federal Migration Service agency or a telex from the Russian Ministry of Foreign Affairs.
5. Introductory letter from your College/University giving full details of the traveller, destinations, dates and purpose of the visit as well as stating the name of inviting organization, contact details of the responsible person in Russia and explaining who will take financial responsibility of the trip.
Please note that this is no longer listed on the website. However, VFS Global have informed me that they may give students a visa without the letter, but that they may ask for the letter. Therefore, I think it wise to continue to obtain a letter and include it with your application.
6. When applying for student visa you must additionally submit HIV Test (AIDS) Certificate taken in last three months. HIV Test (AIDS) Certificate should still be valid for 15- 30 days on the day of your application.
7. The visa fee -- the details are on the VFS Global website.

Item 4 Study in Russia will send UCL your letter of invitation issued by the Russian Federal Migration Service agency 3 to 8 weeks before departure.

Item 5 Ben Chatterley will provide the letter. This should state that you are a full time student and indicate where you are studying in Russia and the course dates.

Item 6 HIV TEST

All you require is a letter from your GP or a clinic stating that you are HIV negative. As long as it is on official headed notepaper, it will be acceptable. The nearest GUM clinic to UCL is the Camden Mortimer Market Clinic, where a free test is done, with results given while you wait.

If you ask for your passport to be returned by post, it will be returned to you by courier. You will be informed of the total cost including postage at the end of the application process.

Your visa will be stuck in your passport. Your visa invitation and any documents you have sent will be retained and not returned to you. When you receive your visa, you must check that there are no mistakes and, if necessary, return it for corrections. Check that the start date for the visa is the date of your flight or earlier.

You visa will be a single entry one (однократная виза). You are responsible for applying for your visa in time. Do not leave it until the last moment, as sudden unpredictable changes in regulations can cause delays.
